## Global Overview of Antisemitism in 2025



# Executive Summary

1

This Annual Report presents a **global overview of antisemitism in 2025**, drawing exclusively on **real-world incidents** that were documented and confirmed in mainstream and Jewish media, alongside **analysis of antisemitic discourse trends online**.

2

Findings indicate sustained high levels of antisemitic activity across multiple regions, with clear concentration in a small number of countries.

The **USA, the UK, Australia, France, Canada, and several European states** accounted for the highest volumes of reported incidents, underscoring the persistence of antisemitism as a transnational security and social challenge.

Temporal and geographic analysis shows that antisemitic incidents increased sharply following major conflict-related events, with repeated spikes observed across multiple countries. Incident data from 2025 confirms a wide range of antisemitic activity, including harassment, vandalism, and multiple lethal attacks targeting Jewish individuals and institutions. in 2025—ranging from harassment and vandalism to severe violence, including lethal attacks targeting Jewish institutions and individuals.

A dedicated case study on **Australia's Bondi Beach attack** illustrates the evolving threat landscape, including small-cell terrorism, legal access to weapons, and rapid post-attack escalation in related antisemitic incidents and online amplification.

The report also documents the **parallel intensification of antisemitism** in the information environment.

Initial findings on the scale and sentiment of antisemitism across social media are included in this report, with more comprehensive platform-level analysis and network mapping to follow in the final report.

An analysis of ten prominent **fake** news cases demonstrates how misinformation, miscaptioned imagery, and distorted claims—particularly around Gaza—shaped international narratives and fueled hostility toward Jews and Israel.

In parallel, the report tracks the institutionalization of **anti-Israel pressure through** major **policy decisions** and a high volume of **UN resolutions**, as well as the role of prominent **influencers** and **networks** in driving anti-Zionist and antisemitic narratives.




# Global Antisemitism in 2025

The following data presents an overview of reported antisemitic incidents globally in 2025, based exclusively on real-world incidents that were documented and confirmed in mainstream and Jewish media.

The analysis examines temporal trends, geographic distribution by continent and country, and patterns of online antisemitic discourse. Together, the charts and maps below illustrate variations in incident volume over time, concentration across regions and countries, and the scale and sentiment of antisemitic activity on social media platforms, providing a comprehensive picture of antisemitism in 2025.

The heat map illustrates the intensity of antisemitism by country, with darker red indicating the highest levels and lighter red indicating the lowest



The heat map illustrates the intensity of antisemitism by state, with darker red indicating the highest levels and lighter red indicating the lowest



The graph presents a sentiment analysis of mentions of Jews on X between January 1, 2025 and December 31, 2025


The analysis presents the volume and sentiment distribution of antisemitic content on X (formerly Twitter) throughout 2025. It quantifies the total number of identified antisemitic posts and classifies them by sentiment—negative, neutral, and positive—revealing that negative sentiment dominates the discourse. This distribution highlights the prevalence of hostile and antagonistic narratives, while neutral and positive mentions comprise a smaller share of overall activity, offering insight into the tone and scale of antisemitic online discourse in 2025.

# Monthly Antisemitism Trends: Online vs. Incidents

The chart presents a monthly **comparison between antisemitic incidents and antisemitic posts** over the course of 2025.

Antisemitic incidents are shown on the left vertical axis, while antisemitic posts (measured in millions) are shown on the right vertical axis.

**Partial convergence between the two trends** is observed in **June, July** and **September**, when elevated levels of online antisemitic content coincide with relatively high incident counts.




Comparative Monthly Trends in Antisemitic Incidents and Online Antisemitic Activity, Highlighting Divergent Patterns

# Top 10 Incidents

The following section outlines the most significant antisemitic attacks in 2025, based on the level of physical harm inflicted on Jewish individuals and communities.

## **Australia: Terrorists open fire at Hanukkah celebration in Bondi Beach, killing 15 and injuring dozens**

Fifteen people were killed and dozens injured when two gunmen opened fire on a Hanukkah celebration at Bondi Beach in Sydney.

## **UK: Terror attack on Manchester synagogue leaves two worshippers dead<sup>1</sup>**

Two people were killed and three others seriously injured when a car-ramming and stabbing attack targeted worshippers outside a synagogue on Yom Kippur.

## **USA: Gunman kills 2 Israeli embassy staff outside DC Jewish museum<sup>2</sup>**

Two Israeli Embassy staffers were shot and killed outside Washington, D.C.'s Capital Jewish Museum, with the suspect shouting "Free Palestine" upon arrest

# Top 10 Incidents

## **USA: Firebomb attack at Boulder pro-Israel vigil kills elderly woman, injures 12<sup>3</sup>**

An 82-year-old woman died from injuries sustained in a firebombing attack in which a man used Molotov cocktails and a makeshift flamethrower to assault a group advocating for the release of Israeli hostages, injuring multiple people.

## **Greece: Israeli tourist hospitalized after pro-Palestinian attacker bites part of his ear off<sup>5</sup>**

An Israeli tourist in Athens said a man shouting "Free Palestine... I am Hamas" bit off part of his ear during a beach altercation, and claimed both he and the attacker were later arrested by Greek police.

## **Canada: Elderly Jewish woman stabbed in Ottawa grocery store<sup>6</sup>**

An elderly Jewish woman was stabbed in a grocery store by a man later arrested at the scene, who authorities say has a documented history of antisemitic statements and online posts expressing hatred toward Jews and Judaism.

## **Australia: Childcare center torched and sprayed with antisemitic graffiti<sup>7</sup>**

A childcare centre in Sydney was set alight and spray painted with antisemitic graffiti. The building was extensively damaged. The fence of the childcare centre was spray painted with "F\*\*\* the Jews".

## **UK: Israeli music producer kidnapped, beaten, and chained by 3 men in Wales in antisemitic ransom plot<sup>8</sup>**

Three men lured Israeli-born music producer Itay Kashti to a remote cottage in Wales under false pretences, where they beat, threatened, and handcuffed him in a failed kidnapping.

## **Australia: Synagogue set on fire during Shabbat meal with 20 people inside<sup>9</sup>**

A man poured a flammable liquid on the entrance of the East Melbourne Hebrew Congregation synagogue and set it alight while about 20 people were inside, forcing worshippers to evacuate without injuries.

# Top 10 Incidents

## Case Study - Australia: Antisemitic Violence and Security Implications

On **14 December 2025**, two gunmen opened fire during a **public Hanukkah celebration organized by Chabad of Bondi** at Bondi Beach, Sydney. The attack took place during the first-night candle lighting near Bondi Park and was attended by families and children. Witnesses reported **20–50 gunshots**, triggering mass panic and lockdowns in nearby businesses. Emergency services responded within minutes. Authorities confirmed **approximately 15 fatalities and numerous wounded**, including a **Chabad emissary**. One attacker was subdued by a civilian; the second was killed during a police engagement.



## Perpetrators and Radicalization

The attackers were identified as **Sajid Akram (50)**, a Pakistani-born Australian resident, and his son **Naveed Akram (24)**, an Australian citizen. Sajid held a **valid firearms license** and legally owned multiple rifles, with no prior criminal record. Naveed had previously drawn intelligence attention due to associations with an **ISIS-linked network**, though he was not under active monitoring at the time of the attack. Investigations concluded that both attackers had **pledged allegiance to ISIS**. ISIS flags and improvised explosive devices were recovered from their vehicle, indicating **ideological motivation**. Security services confirmed the pair had traveled to the **southern Philippines** weeks earlier, where they are believed to have undergone militant training.



## Attack Assessment

Australian authorities assessed the shooting as a **lone-actor-style terrorist attack carried out by a family cell**, with no evidence of broader operational coordination. Key security patterns included:

- ▶ Legal access to firearms
- ▶ Prior ideological exposure without sustained monitoring
- ▶ Symbolic targeting of a Jewish religious event
- ▶ Small-cell operational autonomy

## Post-Attack Impact

In the days following the attack, **multiple antisemitic incidents** were reported nationwide, including a **firebombing of a rabbi's vehicle in Melbourne** and antisemitic abuse of Jewish students in Sydney. A clear **clustering of incidents** occurred within ten days of the attack.

## Government and Policy Response











Prime Minister **Anthony Albanese** announced a package of reforms addressing antisemitism and extremism, including **aggravated hate speech offenses**, expanded visa cancellation powers, and simplified prosecution mechanisms. Parallel announcements focused on **tightening firearms regulations**, with public scrutiny centered on the attackers' legal weapon access.

## Online Antisemitism

Online monitoring showed a **sharp surge in antisemitic discourse**, with volumes rising over **400% on the day of the attack** and remaining significantly elevated through December. The sustained spike suggests the attack acted as a **catalyst for extremist amplification, misinformation, and opportunistic hate speech**.

# Significant Anti-Israel UN Resolutions in the Context of Antisemitism

This section examines significant United Nations resolutions from 2025, analyzing their implications for Israel and their role in shaping international legal, diplomatic, and political pressure in the context of antisemitism.

 April 2 2025	HRC 58/2 – Human rights situation in the OPT, incl. East Jerusalem (UNHRC) <sup>10</sup>	Positions Israel as the primary violator in Gaza & the West Bank; calls for international accountability, legitimizes arms embargo language, endorses ICJ/ICC pressure, and advances long-term legal isolation.
 April 4 2025	HRC 58/26 – Human rights in the occupied Syrian Golan (UNHRC) <sup>11</sup>	Reasserts that Israel's control of the Golan is illegal; pressures Israel to reverse administrative/legal integration regardless of Syrian context.
 April 4 2025	HRC 58/27 – Right of the Palestinian people to self-determination (UNHRC) <sup>12</sup>	Reinforces UN position that Israeli occupation blocks Palestinian statehood; political pressure tool rather than operational change.
 April 4 2025	HRC 58/28 – Israeli settlements in the OPT & Syrian Golan (UNHRC) <sup>13</sup>	Declares settlements illegal, urges cessation and dismantling, and encourages states to differentiate between Israel and settlements.
 June 12 2025	GA ES-10 – Protection of civilians & humanitarian obligations (UNGA Emergency Special Session) <sup>14</sup>	Gaza-war resolution that condemns Israeli aid restrictions, frames Israel as violating humanitarian law, and legitimizes collective international pressure.
 September 12, 2025	UNGA – Endorsement of the New York Declaration <sup>15</sup>	Makes a UN-backed conference document the official UN roadmap, locking in demands on Israel regarding occupation, Jerusalem, and legal accountability.
 December 2, 2025	UNGA – Peaceful settlement of the question of Palestine <sup>16</sup>	Umbrella resolution blaming Israel for lack of peace; reiterates withdrawal, settlements illegality, Jerusalem status, refugees – without naming Hamas.
 December 5, 2025	UNGA – Work of the Special Committee to Investigate Israeli Practices <sup>17</sup>	Renews a permanent UN body focused solely on Israel, institutionalizing ongoing investigation of Israeli actions only.
 December 5, 2025	UNGA – Israeli settlements in the OPT & Syrian Golan <sup>18</sup>	GA version of settlement condemnation; reinforces illegality and calls on states to act accordingly.
 December 5, 2025	UNGA – Operations of UNRWA <sup>19</sup>	Condemns harm to UNRWA operations in Gaza and demands Israeli facilitation; does not address Hamas use of UN facilities.

# Notable Fake News Stories

This section examines notable fake news stories from 2025, highlighting recurring patterns of misinformation, visual manipulation, and narrative distortion that amplified polarization and antisemitic sentiment in the context of Israel and Gaza.

Date	Image	News	Description
April 2025 ,		False claims of Gazan resettlement in Ukraine or Syria	Social media posts falsely asserted that U.S. President Trump and Israeli Prime Minister Netanyahu announced a plan to relocate or resettle 1.5 million Gazans in Ukraine and Syria. Independent fact-checking found no credible evidence of such a plan, and the video cited was taken out of context, with no statements by either leader about designated relocation sites for Gazans <sup>20</sup> .
May, 2025		Misreported death of Gazan child, Abdul Rahim Muhammad Hamdene	Reports circulated online and in the media claiming that eight-year-old Abdul Rahim Muhammad Hamdene had been killed during Israeli military activity while seeking humanitarian aid. Later verification showed that the child was alive and with his family, demonstrating that the initial reports were inaccurate and based on unverified or erroneous information. <sup>21</sup>
May 20–23, 2025		Misleading claim about 14,000 Gazan babies dying in 48 hours	A United Nations under-secretary-general's warning was widely shared that "14,000 babies will die in the next 48 hours" unless aid reached Gaza, implying an imminent large-scale death toll from malnutrition. The comment was referenced by media outlets, social media posts, and political figures, but the official report he cited actually projected that an estimated **14,100 children under age 5 could experience severe acute malnutrition over an 11-month period, not within two days. Multiple news organizations updated or corrected their coverage after the UN clarified that the figure was based on a long-term projection (IPC report) rather than a precise short-term death count. <sup>22</sup>
June 19, 2025		Misrepresentation of militant operatives as "journalists killed in Gaza"	A viral post by a high-profile account claimed that roughly one-third of Tel Aviv had been damaged or destroyed following Iran's response and that Israeli military aircraft were relocated to Cyprus. The claim garnered millions of views but was not supported by official damage assessments, satellite imagery, or credible media reporting, and significantly exaggerated the scale of destruction. <sup>23</sup>






Date	Image	News	Description
June 23, 2025		False claim that Israeli pilot was captured by Iran	Viral posts on X and Facebook claimed that an Israeli Air Force pilot named "Sarah Ahronot" was captured by Iran following the June 2025 escalation, using an image that garnered over one million views. Reuters Fact Check confirmed the image showed a Chilean Navy pilot from a 2021 interview, not an Israeli pilot, and Israeli authorities denied that any pilots were captured. <sup>24</sup>
Mid-2025		Misleading Gaza starvation image involving Osama al-Rakab	A widely circulated image of a severely underweight Gazan child was shared on social media and mainstream media in online discourse as evidence of deliberate starvation caused by Israel. Subsequent reporting and official statements indicated that the child, Osama al-Rakab, suffers from a serious pre-existing medical condition unrelated to food deprivation, and that the image was used without proper medical or contextual clarification, rendering the starvation narrative misleading. <sup>25</sup>
August, 2025		Staged Gaza 'starvation' photos circulated globally as evidence of famine.	Images depicting Gazans as starving were widely published and shared internationally as proof of mass famine in Gaza. Subsequent analysis and documentation indicated that several of the most prominent photographs were taken in a controlled aid distribution environment and selectively framed to emphasize distress prior to food distribution. Repeated use of the same individuals and locations suggested staging or selective framing, while the images were presented as authentic. <sup>26</sup>
August 10, 2025		Misrepresentation of militant operatives as "journalists killed in Gaza"	International reporting and social media narratives frequently described individuals killed in Gaza as "journalists," without disclosing verified affiliations with Hamas, Palestinian Islamic Jihad, or Hamas-run media outlets. Subsequent investigations and documentation revealed that a number of those labeled as journalists were active members or operatives of terror organizations, or employees of media entities directly controlled by Hamas. The omission of these affiliations contributed to misleading portrayals of civilian casualties and press targeting. <sup>27</sup>



Date	Image	News	Description
October 13, 2025		Misleading framing by CNN correspondent Christiane Amanpour	CNN's chief international anchor Christiane Amanpour issued multiple public apologies following statements that were widely criticized as inaccurate or insensitive in the context of the Israel–Gaza conflict. These included remarks suggesting Israeli hostages were "probably being treated better than the average Gazan," the characterization of terror attacks as "shootouts," and past analogies that critics argued trivialized or inappropriately referenced the Holocaust. <sup>28</sup>
December, 2025		AI-generated Gaza flooding video misrepresented as real	A short video showing children wading through deep floodwaters in Gaza was widely shared on social media with captions suggesting it was real footage of winter flooding in the "war-torn territory". Fact-checkers found visual anomalies and AI artifacts in the footage, and compared it to verified photographs of flooding, concluding that the viral clip was AI-generated or heavily manipulated rather than authentic documentation of conditions on the ground. This misinformation spread across multiple languages and platforms, blending real context (rain and some flooding due to Storm Byron) with fabricated visuals. <sup>29</sup>



- ▶ The accompanying graphs distinguish between two sets of individuals and groups using color coding:
  - ▷ **The red dots highlight the 10 influencers** that play significant roles in shaping narratives, including public figures such as **Tucker Carlson** and **Greta Thunberg**.
  - ▷ **The blue dots represent other individuals or groups in the broader network** that were not selected for highlighting but remain part of the analysis.
- ▶ Each has demonstrated problematic activity or content related to Jews, Israel, or both, and is ranked based on a severity scale, from most severe to least.







# 10 Major Anti-Israel Policy Decisions

- ▶ In 2025, Israel faced an unprecedented wave of **coordinated diplomatic, legal, economic, and cultural actions by states and multilateral institutions**, marking a **significant shift in international policy towards it**.
- ▶ Across **Europe, Latin America**, and the **United Nations** system, **governments moved beyond rhetorical criticism to concrete measures**, ranging from **arms embargoes** and **divestment decisions** to **international legal proceedings, trade suspensions**, and **high-profile cultural boycotts**.
- ▶ Collectively, these actions reflected the **growing institutionalization of pressure on Israel over the Gaza war and the broader Palestinian issue**, embedding **anti-Israel positions into formal state policy**, legal frameworks, and international governance mechanisms.

1	<b>ICC Rejects Israel's Request to Withdraw Arrest Warrants</b>	22 May 16 & July	The Hague, Netherlands	ICC prosecutor Karim Khan <b>opposed Israel's bid to withdraw arrest warrants for Prime Minister Netanyahu and Defence Minister Gallant</b> ;in July ,ICC judges rejected Israel's request to halt the Gaza investigation ,leaving the 2024 arrest warrants in force and confirming the Court's jurisdiction over crimes in the occupied Palestinian territories <sup>3031</sup> .
2	<b>Paris Air Show Restrictions</b>	16–22 June	Paris Air Show ,Le Bourget	At the <b>2025 Paris Air Show</b> ,Israeli <b>defence companies such as IAI, Elbit and Rafael</b> were allowed to attend <b>but found their stands walled off behind black panels</b> , with French authorities ordering the removal of offensive weapon systems <sup>3233</sup> .

3	<b>The Hague Group's Coordinated Measures Against Israel</b>	15–16 July	Bogotá ,Colombia	<b>At an Emergency Conference of "The Hague Group"</b> co-chaired by Colombia and South Africa, <b>30 states met and 12 of them jointly adopted six coordinated legal, economic and diplomatic measures" to halt the Gaza genocide,"</b> including <b>arms embargoes on Israel ,restrictions on ships carrying arms ,reviews of public contracts linked to Israeli institutions ,and support for war-crimes prosecutions ,</b> tied to UNGA Resolution A/RES/ES <sup>34</sup> .10/24-
4	<b>Spain &amp; Slovenia Arms Bans</b>	July & September	Madrid ,Spain; Ljubljana ,Slovenia	<b>Spain cancelled three major arms contracts with Israeli companies</b> (rocket launchers, targeting pods ,anti-tank missiles) and <b>imposed a permanent arms embargo</b> ,including bans on air and sea transit of arms and fuel for the IDF <sup>37 36 35</sup> .Slovenia became the first EU member to ban all weapons trade with Israel <sup>38</sup> .
5	<b>Norwegian Sovereign Wealth Fund Divestment</b>	12 August	Oslo ,Norway	<b>Norway's Government Pension Fund Global announced it would sell its holdings in11 Israeli companies</b> ,move Israeli investments in-house and end contracts with external managers operating in Israel , <b>citing the deteriorating humanitarian situation in Gaza</b> and the need for stricter due diligence in conflict zones <sup>3940</sup> .

7	<b>Spain Launches Special Prosecutorial Task Force on Gaza War Crimes</b>	18 September	Madrid ,Spain	<b>Spain authorized a special prosecutorial task force to investigate alleged war crimes in Gaza</b> ,following an intelligence report from the National Police .The unit will <b>collect and preserve evidence for referral to the ICC and ICJ</b> ,as domestic prosecution is limited by Spain's jurisdictional laws <sup>43 42</sup> .

10	<b>Eurovision Boycotts</b>	December	Europe	Five European broadcasters ( <b>Spain, Slovenia, the Netherlands, Iceland, Ireland</b> ) <b>boycotted Eurovision 2026 in protest at Israel's participation</b> , citing mass civilian deaths in Gaza <sup>46</sup> .
