ORAL STATEMENT BY THE SECRETARIAT IN CONNECTION WITH DRAFT RESOLUTION A/HRC/6/L.48 ENTITLED "MANDATE OF THE SPECIAL RAPPORTEUR ON THE SITUATION OF HUMAN RIGHTS IN SUDAN"

- 1. This oral statement is made in accordance with rule 153 of the rules of procedure of the General Assembly.
- 2. Under the terms of operative paragraphs 1 and 1 (c) of draft resolution A/HRC/6/L.48, the Human Rights Council, would:
  - (i) decide to extend for one year the mandate of the Special Rapporteur on the situation of human rights in Sudan;
  - (ii) request the Special Rapporteur to submit a full annual report before the end of 2008, as well as all outstanding reports, in accordance with its annual programme of work;
- 3. Should the draft resolution be adopted by the Human Rights Council, a total amount of \$50,700 per year will be required to implement the activities called for in operative paragraphs 1 and 1 (c), as follows:
  - (i) travel of the Special Rapporteur for consultations/to attend the annual meeting of special procedures and to present a report to the Human Rights Council and for 2 field missions per year (\$36,200);
  - (ii) travel of staff to accompany the Special Rapporteur during field missions (\$7,300); and
- 4. The requirements to implement the activities for the mandate of the Special Rapporteur have been included under Section 23, Human Rights, of the proposed programme budget for the biennium 2008-2009. No additional appropriations would be required as a result of the adoption of the draft resolution.
