	The young Arab man took part in the bloody riots and attempted murders of police officers and Jewish citizens. His actions began on May 11, 2021, when the young man threw stones with a group of Arabs in an attempt to hit police officers. Later in the same day he came to the Art and Judaica Gallery in the Old City of Acre and broke into it with some of his friends where they wreaked havoc, vandalized the art items on the spot and stole some of the precious works, driven by racist motives and hatred of Jews. After the looting, he set fire to the place and continued the pogrom in other locations in the city.
	He then set fire to another Jewish-owned business, a two- story gallery called "Handmade in Baba Yaga". He arrived at the art store with his friends with a gasoline container in his hand and after looting the place, dismantled the doors and

	sinks and broke all the property in it and set fire to the gallery.
	The next day, May 12, he and his Arab friends rested from the night's labor, dozens of them went on another riot campaign near the Knights' Hostel and began throwing stones in an attempt to hit police officers. Near the Al-Ghazar Mosque, he broke and sabotaged the security cameras and took the camera system's memory drive from the mosque so that he and his partners could not be identified. Later that night, the rioters arrived at the "Turkish Bath" Museum - an Ottoman bath with cultural, historical and artistic value located in the heart of residential buildings. He and his friends entered the ancient compound that had already been broken into and looted earlier by others, and continued to sow destruction while breaking everything and setting the compound on fire.
	That night, under the influence his racist antisemitic madness he and his partners continued to a spice shop in the heart of the ancient market and owned by Shimon Malka, an Israeli Jew who has worked there for decades. They broke into the warehouse and wreaked havoc on it as they tore up the bags of spices and set the store on fire.
