In fact, it mentions neither the Hebrew term for the site – Har HaBayit – nor its English equivalent, the Temple Mount. The site is referred to only by its Muslim names – Al-Aqsa Mosque and Haram al-Sharif.

The UNESCO executive board adopted a similar resolution at the organization's conference in April 2016.

The New York-based Anti-Defamation League said: "To expunge the Jewish connection to Jerusalem is to deny the very cultural heritage of Jerusalem. This is not only unethical, but it contradicts the role of UNESCO to build intercultural understanding and protect cultural heritage."

Without undermining other religions' affiliation to Jerusalem's holy sites, the archaeological facts and historical evidence leave no doubt of the deepest and longest Jewish presence in Jerusalem since ancient times.

UNESCO's attempt to distort history and undercut the Jewish people's ties to Jerusalem is an attempt to rewrite history in a dangerous, unfair and one-sided manner.

UNESCO's distorted resolution provides perceived justification for violence against Jews accessing the Temple Mount or Israeli security forces entering the compound.
