Human rights violation/s or abuses alleged to have occurred	<p>A root cause of terrorist attacks and other human rights violations against Israelis is justification and defense of terrorism by various international organizations.</p> <p>One of the organizations defending those linked to terror is <u>BADIL - Resource Center for Palestinian Residency and Refugee Rights.</u></p> <p>On December 30, 2019, BADIL and other Palestinian NGOs launched a “Palestinian National Campaign to Reject Conditional Funding” which rejects new requirements in European Union grant contracts that prohibit grantees from working with and funding organizations and individuals designated on the EU’s terror lists. In the campaign, BADIL labeled this policy as “conditioned funding” and “so-called anti-terrorism clauses and policies...on preventing terrorism that affect the history and struggle of our people” (emphasis added), justified the use of violence, and claimed that the “Palestinian resistance factions are not terrorist organizations.” (see video clip).</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> On May 7, 2020, BADIL published a position paper calling EU measures that bar funding to organizations on the EU’s terror lists “not only morally and politically unacceptable, but also illegal in consideration of international law.”

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • BADIL is a member of Palestinian NGO Network (PNGO), which also vehemently opposed the requirements. PNGO claimed that Palestinian terrorist organizations are “political parties.” • On May 6, 2011, BADIL held a competition in which the PFLP’s Abd Al-Rahim Muluh participated as a judge. According to Al-Jazeera, Muluh was a founder of the PFLP and was sentenced to seven-years in prison. • Rania Elias <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Elias, head of BADIL’s board, has written Facebook posts glorifying numerous PFLP terrorists. • On July 8, 2019, Elias posted a picture of former PFLP spokesman Ghassan Kanafani. PFLP is a proscribed terrorist organization. • Ahmad Lahham, BADIL advocacy and media director, has written Facebook posts sympathetic toward terrorists. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • On March 30, 2019, Lahham published a photo of a mural featuring the faces of three leading PFLP figures: Layla Khaled, PFLP founder; terrorist Wadi’ Haddad, responsible for a number of plane hijackings and other attacks; and spokesperson and writer Ghassan Kanafani. The mural featured the slogan, “behind the enemy everywhere... bodies may fall but not the idea.” • On November 27, 2018, Lahham uploaded a photo of himself sitting in front of two posters: one of Ghassan Kanafani, and the other portraying a person tearing up the Balfour Declaration and stating “Return is our Right and Will.” The picture is captioned, “It would not be possible to live without the hope.” <p>By defending terrorists, BADIL is promoting human rights violations and violence against Israeli civilians.</p> <p>BADIL managers must be held accountable for their crimes.</p>
